## **Suspicious vehicle call leads officers to arrest home burglars**

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, just before 10:00 p.m., La Porte Police Dispatch received a report of a suspicious vehicle parked in the alleyway near the 500 block of South Kansas Street. Upon arrival, officers located a female sitting inside of a parked vehicle. As Officers began a conversation with the female, they quickly observed numerous household and utility items on the ground by the fence line near the rear of an area home.

A check of the residence by other responding officers then revealed an open door. Officers located a male inside the residence living room. As officers began a conversation with the male, he commented that he did not live at the home and that he was disoriented and needed a place to lay down.

Officers then tracked down the owners of the home, who were away at the time. The homeowners were able to exposed the ruse, as the male/female duo were unknown to the owners and had no permission to be in the residence and/or remove property from the home.

Further inquiry led to the identification, arrest, and Burglary of Habitation charges being accepted by the Harris County District Attorney's Office against 22 year-old Chase Moody of Pasadena, while 22 year-old Bobbie Wilkening of Katy was charged with Possession of Marijuana.
