<b>What is the overall deductible?</b>	Network: Individual <b>\$1,500</b> / Family <b>\$4,500</b> . Out-of-Network: Individual <b>\$3,000</b> / Family <b>\$9,000</b> . Does not apply to prescription drugs and preventive care in-network.	You must pay all the costs up to the <b>deductible</b> amount before this plan begins to pay for covered services you use. Check your policy or plan document to see when the <b>deductible</b> starts over (usually, but not always, January 1st). See the chart starting on page 2 for how much you pay for covered services after you meet the <b>deductible</b> .
<b>Are there other deductibles for specific services?</b>	No.	You don't have to meet <b>deductibles</b> for specific services, but see the chart starting on page 2 for other costs for services this plan covers.
<b>Is there an out-of-pocket limit on my expenses?</b>	Yes. Network: Individual <b>\$4,200</b> / Family <b>\$12,600</b> . Out-of-Network: Individual <b>\$9,000</b> / Family <b>\$27,000</b> .	The <b>out-of-pocket limit</b> is the most you could pay during a coverage period (usually one year) for your share of the cost of covered services. This limit helps you plan for health care expenses.
<b>What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?</b>	Premiums, balance-billed charges, penalties for failure to obtain pre-authorization for service, and health care this plan does not cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <b>out-of-pocket limit</b> .
<b>Is there an overall annual limit on what the plan pays?</b>	No.	The chart starting on page 2 describes any limits on what the plan will pay for <i>specific</i> covered services, such as office visits.
<b>Does this plan use a network of providers?</b>	Yes. See <a href="http://www.aetna.com">www.aetna.com</a> or call 1-888-982-3862 for a list of network <b>providers</b> .	If you use an in-network doctor or other health care <b>provider</b> , this plan will pay some or all of the costs of covered services. Be aware, your in-network doctor or hospital may use an out-of-network <b>provider</b> for some services. Plans use the term in-network, <b>preferred</b> , or participating for <b>providers</b> in their <b>network</b> . <b>Do I need a referral to see a specialist?</b>	No.	You can see the <b>specialist</b> you choose without permission from this plan.
<b>Are there services this plan doesn't cover?</b>	Yes.	Some of the services this plan doesn't cover are listed on page 5. See your policy or plan document for additional information about <b>excluded services</b> .

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**Copayments** are fixed dollar amounts (for example, \$15) you pay for covered health care, usually when you receive the service.

**Coinsurance** is *your* share of the costs of a covered service, calculated as a percent of the **allowed amount** for the service. For example, if the plan's **allowed amount** for an overnight hospital stay is \$1,000, your **coinsurance** payment of 20% would be \$200. This may change if you haven't met your **deductible**.

The amount the plan pays for covered services is based on the **allowed amount**. If an out-of-network **provider** charges more than the **allowed amount**, you may have to pay the difference. For example, if an out-of-network hospital charges \$1,500 for an overnight stay and the **allowed amount** is \$1,000, you may have to pay the \$500 difference. (This is called **balance billing**.)

This plan may encourage you to use network **providers** by charging you lower **deductibles**, **copayments**, and **coinsurance** amounts.

**Your Rights to Continue Coverage:**

If you lose coverage under the plan, then, depending upon the circumstances, Federal and State laws may provide protections that allow you to keep health coverage. Any such rights may be limited in duration and will require you to pay a **premium**, which may be significantly higher than the **premium** you pay while covered under the plan. Other limitations on your rights to continue coverage may also apply.

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**Does this Coverage Provide Minimum Essential Coverage?**

The Affordable Care Act establishes a minimum value standard of benefits of a health plan. The minimum value standard is 60% (actuarial value). **This health coverage does meet the minimum value standard for the benefits it provides.**

## Coverage Examples

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## Questions and answers about the Coverage Examples:

### What are some of the assumptions behind the Coverage Examples?

- Costs don't include **premiums**.
- Sample care costs are based on national averages supplied by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and aren't specific to a particular geographic area or health plan.
- The patient's condition was not an excluded or preexisting condition.
- All services and treatments started and ended in the same coverage period.
- There are no other medical expenses for any member covered under this plan.
- Out-of-pocket expenses are based only on treating the condition in the example.
- The patient received all care from in-network **providers**. If the patient had received care from out-of-network **providers**, costs would have been higher.

### What does a Coverage Example show?

For each treatment situation, the Coverage Example helps you see how **deductibles**, **copayments**, and **coinsurance** can add up. It also helps you see what expenses might be left up to you to pay because the service or treatment isn't covered or payment is limited.

### Does the Coverage Example predict my own care needs?

✘ **No.** Treatments shown are just examples. The care you would receive for this condition could be different, based on your doctor's advice, your age, how serious your condition is, and many other factors.

### Does the Coverage Example predict my future expenses?

✘ **No.** Coverage Examples are **not** cost estimators. You can't use the examples to estimate costs for an actual condition. They are for comparative purposes only. Your own costs will be different depending on the care you receive, the prices your **providers** charge, and the reimbursement your health plan allows.

### Can I use Coverage Examples to compare plans?

✔ **Yes.** When you look at the Summary of Benefits and Coverage for other plans, you'll find the same Coverage Examples. When you compare plans, check the "Patient Pays" box in each example. The smaller that number, the more coverage the plan provides.

### Are there other costs I should consider when comparing plans?

✔ **Yes.** An important cost is the **premium** you pay. Generally, the lower your **premium**, the more you'll pay in out-of-pocket costs, such as **copayments**, **deductibles**, and **coinsurance**. You should also consider contributions to accounts such as health savings accounts (HSAs), flexible spending arrangements (FSAs) or health reimbursement accounts (HRAs) that help you pay out-of-pocket expenses.

You may not make any contributions to the HRA. The HRA may only be used to pay a portion of your out-of-pocket expenses incurred under the underlying major medical <b>plan</b> established by your employer, such as <b><u>copayments</u></b>, <b><u>deductibles</u></b> and <b><u>coinsurance</u></b> amounts. Any payments made from your HRA for eligible medical expenses are tax free. Contact your employer or call the Customer Service number on your ID Card for more information.</p>
<p><b>How is the overall deductible or out-of-pocket limit met?</b></p>	<p>Individual <b><u>deductible</u></b> and <b><u>out-of-pocket limit</u></b> payments apply to the family <b><u>deductible</u></b> and <b><u>out-of-pocket limit</u></b>.</p>	<p>The family <b><u>deductible</u></b> and family <b><u>out-of-pocket limit</u></b> are cumulative for all family members. The family <b><u>deductible</u></b> and <b><u>out-of-pocket limit</u></b> can be met by a combination of family members; however no single individual within the family will be subject to more than the individual <b><u>deductible</u></b> or <b><u>out-of-pocket limit</u></b> amount.</p>

**How your out-of-network care is reimbursed:**

We cover the cost of services based on whether doctors are “in-network” or “out-of-network.” We want to help you understand how much Aetna pays for your out-of-network care. At the same time, we want to make it clear how much more you will need to pay for this "out-of-network" care.

You may choose a **provider** (doctor or hospital) in our **network**. You may choose to visit an out-of-network **provider**. If you choose a doctor who is out-of-network, your Aetna health **plan** may pay some of that doctor's bill. Most of the time, you will pay a lot more money out of your own pocket if you choose to use an out-of-network doctor or hospital.

When you choose out-of-network care, Aetna limits the amount it will pay. This limit is called the "recognized" or "**allowed**" **amount**.

Professional Services: 105% of Medicare

Facility Services: 140% of Medicare

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Your doctor sets his or her own rate to charge you. It may be higher -- sometimes much higher -- than what your Aetna plan "recognizes." Your doctor may bill you for the dollar amount that your plan doesn't "recognize." You must also pay any copayments, coinsurance and deductibles under your plan. No dollar amount above the "recognized charge" counts toward your deductible or out-of-pocket limit. You can avoid these extra costs by getting your care from Aetna's network of health care providers. Go to [www.aetna.com](http://www.aetna.com) and click on "Find a Doctor" on the left side of the page. If you are already a member, sign on to your Aetna Navigator® member site.

This applies when you *choose* to get care out-of-network. When you have no choice (for example: emergency room visit after a car accident or for other emergency services), we will pay the bill as if you got care in-network. You pay cost sharing and deductibles for your in-network level of benefits. Contact Aetna if your health care provider asks you to pay more. You are not responsible for any outstanding balance billed by your providers for emergency services beyond your cost sharing and deductibles.

**Other important information about your plan:**

This plan does not cover all health care expenses and includes exclusions and limitations. Members should refer to their plan documents to determine which health care services are covered and to what extent.

- All medical and hospital services not specifically covered in, or which are limited or excluded by your plan documents
- Donor egg retrieval
- Experimental and investigational procedures, except for coverage for medically necessary routine patient care costs for members participating in a cancer clinical trial with respect to the treatment of cancer or other life-threatening disease or condition.
- Home births
- Immunizations for travel or work except where medically necessary or indicated
- Implantable drugs and certain injectable drugs including injectable infertility drugs
- Long-term rehabilitation therapy
- Non-medically necessary services or supplies
- Orthotics except diabetic orthotics
- Outpatient prescription drugs (except for treatment of diabetes), unless covered by a prescription plan rider and over-the-counter medications (except as provided in a hospital) and supplies
- Radial keratotomy or related procedures
- Reversal of sterilization
- Services for the treatment of sexual dysfunction or inadequacies, including therapy, supplies, counseling or prescription drugs
- Therapy or rehabilitation other than those listed as covered

The charges that Aetna negotiates with Aetna Rx Home Delivery may be higher than the cost they pay for the drugs and the cost of the mail order pharmacy services they provide. For these purposes, the pharmacy's cost of purchasing drugs takes into account discounts, credits and other amounts that they may receive from wholesalers, manufacturers, suppliers and distributors.
