Meeting Minutes

July 13, 2017

Call To Order

Clayton Hackett called to order the regular meeting of the LEPC on July 13, 2017 at 11:05 a.m. at 2015 Sens Road, La Porte, Texas.

Introductions

Introductions were made around the room. Members are reminded to sign in on the attendance sheet at the back of the room.

Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting

A motion by Ray Cook, Dow Chemical, was made to accept the May 11, 2017 meeting minutes with a correction to the "Call to Order" section. Kristin Gauthier, City of La Porte, seconded the motion. A vote was taken; Motion carried.

Reports

a) Emergency Communications – Kristin Gauthier:

1. Incidents -

a. TOTAL Petrochemicals, 6/27/17: At 0750, the TOTAL Petrochemicals Polypropylene Plant, located at 1818 Independence Pkwy South, experienced a failure of a 13kV Capacitor Bank. This resulted in a site power failure and loss of steam to our flares. There was heavy smoke from the flares until steam generation was restored approximately 20 minutes later. There were no injuries as a result of the incident.

Kristin emphasized the importance of submitting an E-Notify report before a CAER line message, and that an E-Notify should be submitted for any Level 1 activity as a courtesy to let your surrounding neighbors and responsible agencies know what is taking place. She also reminded members that when having a drill, the notification can be sent through E-Notify instead of having to place a phone call to the City.

2. Reverse Drills:

- a. 5/18/17 Goodyear: Facility was contacted by Dispatch around 2:00 a.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 2:10 a.m. An All Clear was submitted at 2:12 a.m. No issues.
- 5/24/17 OxyVinyls La Porte: Facility was contacted by Dispatch around 10:00 p.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 10:22 p.m. No All Clear was received from the facility.
- c. 6/1/17 PeroxyChem: Facility was contacted by Dispatch around 8:30 p.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 8:38 p.m. An All Clear was submitted at 8:38 p.m. No issues.
- **d.** 6/9//17 AkzoNobel Battleground: Facility was contacted by Dispatch around 2:00 a.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 2:10 a.m. No All Clear was received from the facility.
- e. 6/12/17 Kuraray POVAL: Facility was contacted by Dispatch around 10:00 p.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 10:13 p.m. No All Clear was received from the facility.
- f. 6/20/17 Dow Bayport: Facility was contacted by Dispatch around 8:18 p.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 8:25 p.m., CAER line message at 8:28 p.m., and Reverse LEPC drill at 8:29 p.m. An All Clear was submitted at 8:34 p.m. No issues.
- g. 6/28/17 Altivia: Facility was contacted at around 2:00 a.m. with no answer at number listed.
- h. 7/4/17 LyondellBasell Choate: Facility was contacted at around 10:25 p.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 10:27 p.m. An All Clear was submitted at 10:51 p.m. No issues.
- i. 7/12/17 Praxair: Facility was contacted at around 2:00 a.m. and they submitted an E-Notify at 2:09 a.m. An All Clear was submitted at 2:16 a.m. No issues.

Kristin reminded all members to verify their 24-hour numbers with staff and to remember to give an "All Clear" on the Reverse Drills.

3. E-Notify Update – Dan Heiken: Dan was not present. Jeff announced that the EHCMA Emergency Management and Communications Committee is continuing to work on various updates to the E-Notify system. The new system process training is scheduled to begin in September and the new system rollout is scheduled for the end of October.

- b) Emergency Response & Resources Richard Bass: Richard was not present. Clayton announced that the CIMA Drill is scheduled for September 26 and more updates will follow.
- c) Hazardous Materials Facility Liaison Burch Estes: No report.
- d) Planning Lance Hardcastle: Lance was not present. Clayton announced the Planning Committee will be meeting later in the month to start working on the RMP for Fixed Facilities and that more updates will follow.
- e) Public Education & Information Dena Mahan: Kristin announced the Emergency Preparedness Guide has been mailed to all City of La Porte, Morgan's Point, and Shoreacres residents. She added that we had reached 1000 downloads of the Emergency Preparedness app, and over half of the residents used the app to register for the City's Phone Notification System. The guide will be uploaded to the LEPC Website and to social media. Training for La Porte ISD's New Teacher Orientation will take place in August.
- f) Membership Committee Bill Bower: Bill announced that we are at mid-point in the year and we have thirty-seven companies that have missed two or more meetings this year. He reminded all members that, if you can't attend regularly, you need to find an alternate who can attend in your place
- g) Treasurer's Report: We took in receipts of \$104,246.36 in a Walmart refund for decorations to be used on the LEPC Parade float, and \$92,662.80 for the TCEQ LEPC Grant to be used for various projects. Total disbursements equaled \$34,727.82, including a payment to Emerge, City of La Porte, Richard Laird (CPA), La Porte High School Theatre Department, May lunch expenses, postage, ribbons and gift certificates for the Baker 6th Grade poster contest, LEPC Float banner, trinkets/giveaways, and graphics for development of the Emergency Preparedness Guide. The total available funds as of June 30, 2017 was \$149,551.04.
- h) Safety Fair Kristin Gauthier: Kristin announced the Safety Fair flyer and registration form has been emailed to all LEPC members and previous year exhibitors, and that the Safety Fair will take place on September 23rd from 10-1 at La Porte High School. She reminded all members that if they are not currently on a committee, the Safety Fair committee could use all the help they can get either on the day before or day of the event. The committee is also looking for sponsors for the event.
- i) 30th Anniversary Jeff Suggs: Jeff announced the 30th Anniversary celebration event will take place on Thursday, November 9, at the Sylvan Beach Pavilion. He reminded members to let him know if they would like to serve on this committee. More updates to follow.

Old Business

- a) LEPC Member Survey: Dena Mahan gave a presentation on the member survey results. She thanked the members who participated in the survey and stated that all suggestions would be forwarded to the appropriate committees for review and possible implementation. She also encouraged all members to notify staff with any suggestions they may have and/or changes they would like to see implemented for the LEPC at any time.
- b) LEPC Parade Float, Recognition of Volunteers: Clayton announced he would like to thank all of the members who participated in the City of La Porte's 125th Anniversary Parade, and gave special thanks to Ray Cook, and Dow, for the use of their fire truck to pull the float.

New Business

- a) LPHS "Friends of the Theatre" Donation: Kristin announced the LEPC would be making a one thousand (\$1,000) donation to the LPHS Friends of the Theatre group in appreciation for developing a video for the Wally Wise Program. Funds from this donation will be applied to their annual high school musical or play.
- b) EPA LEPC Monthly Webinars: Kristin announced the EPA is not hosting their annual Region 6 LEPC workshop this year. Instead, they are offering monthly one-hour webinars on various topics to be held the fourth Tuesday of each month at 10:00 a.m. She also reminded members of the overall EPCRA online training. We will email information about these training opportunities to the membership.
- c) Region 6 LEPC Update: Clayton discussed some of the forthcoming changes in Sections 311 and 312 of EPCRA's reporting requirements, and encouraged everyone to read about these changes that will go into effect on January 1, 2018. Copies of the newsletter were made available in the back of the room.

Presentations

a) A presentation was made by Assistant Fire Chief Donald Ladd with the La Porte Fire Department to provide an overview on the operations of their department and how they assist in the community.
